The British Prep, Gangnam House of British Education Korea Group (www.bek.co.kr) is seeking new staff for the academic year 2019/20. This is a wonderful opportunity for professional teachers to further develop their career and to be involved in the development of a growing school over the coming years.

The British Prep, which currently accepts students up to Year 9, is located in the well-known suburb of Gangnam, Seoul, South Korea and is part of the larger British Education Korea group which owns and operates four private schools across Seoul's suburbs. The BEK group is seeking to expand, offering up to IGCSE (2019) and subsequently to expand to A Levels. This expansion plan includes a new dedicated secondary campus for the academic year of 2019/20.

All schools are members of COBIS and The British Prep / new senior school are in the process of gaining Cambridge International school accreditation.

We are looking for applicants for the following positions;

- **IGCSE Coordinator/Subject Teacher:**

The candidate must have experience in coordinating and teaching the IGCSE in an international setting (and ideally up to A Level). The post holds a teaching component and it is anticipated that this will be in English and / or Humanities. This will represent the BEK group's first ever group of students put forward to sit IGCSE examinations and as such the school is ambitious to set the standard for subsequent student groups.

The ideal candidate would have a solid record in teaching, be self-motivated and flexible and able to work in a small, growing school group with passionate school administrators and teachers. A Bachelor's Degree in English is preferable and experience at IGCSE Management level is essential.

- **Class Teacher for Key Stage 3/Science Specialist:**

The candidate is expected to teach General Science in the Prep Phase. Students follow a general Science curriculum with topics linked to the National Curriculum of England and content and practical tasks to develop knowledge and skills in preparation for IGCSE studies.

The ideal candidate would also have experience in teaching the IGCSE Coordinated Science (Biology, Chemistry and Physics). Children have timetabled Biology, Chemistry and Physics lessons and are taught by subject specialists, which helps them to prepare fully for IGCSE level study and making their option choices. In Year 10 & 11, students will follow Cambridge International Examination IGCSE courses in Chemistry, Biology and Physics.

- **Class Teachers for Key Stage 1:**

The ideal candidate is an experienced practitioner who is committed to further developing Key Stage 1 curriculum and co-curricular programme in a vibrant learning environment. At The British Prep, Key Stage 1 aims to provide a smooth transition from the Foundation Stage, incorporating elements of continuous provision, opportunities for independent inquiry and allowing for student-led learning where possible. Candidates should be able to demonstrate excellent interpersonal skills and an ability to establish good working relationship, creative approach to learning within an integrated curriculum and a strong understanding of how the environment can impact student learning.

A minimum of two years teaching experience is required either in the UK or overseas with UK National Curriculum teaching experience, regardless of nationality. Applicants holding a Bachelor's degree in Education, or a first degree plus a post-graduate qualification in education (i.e. PGCE) is also essential.

- **EAL Specialist/Class Teacher:**

The candidate is expected to be passionate about implementing an EAL curriculum and extra-curricular programme in a vibrant learning environment. The post involves teaching EAL support throughout KS1 to KS3. Candidates should be highly resourceful, forward-thinking professionals who are actively aware of the latest developments in education, so that they can provide the best learning opportunities for our students.

At least 2 years teaching experience is required in the U.K. or overseas, regardless of nationality. Applicants with a Bachelor's degree plus a recognized EAL qualification are highly sought but previous experience in teaching EAL will be considered. All applicants should possess fluency in both spoken and written English.

- **Bilingual Teachers for Key Stage 1 & 2:**

BEK group recognises that exceptional and inspirational bilingual Assistant Teachers are a valuable resource in providing our children with an excellent international education. Our Bilingual Teachers are ambitious for their students' learning and put students first in everything they do. They have the highest aspirations for their students achievements and developments, both in the classroom and through the many extra-curricular activities on offer.

The ideal candidate is expected to support the Lead Teachers, to plan and implement effective learning and teaching, to assess, provide feedback and communicate with parents on student learning and progress and to develop supportive and safe learning environments. The idea candidate should possess a Bachelor's degree and fluency in Korean and English is essential. A genuine love of children and their care should be evident.

The School offers to successful candidates based on experience;

Working Hours;

- The work of a full-time teacher cannot be confined to a rigid timetable or quantified by the number of hours worked. In addition to their formal timetable, the teacher will spend whatever hours are necessary to fulfill their professional obligations and make a valid and worthwhile contribution to the total life of the school.
- In addition, they may be asked to cover for absent colleagues provided that the teaching is during the working hours.
- The normal working day runs from 8.00 am - 4.45 pm with After School Clubs from 3.40 - 4.25 pm. All full-time members of staff should be available on campus throughout the working day unless they have been given specific permission otherwise by the Principal are engaged in some official activity or are ill.
- Teachers are expected to support special school events.
- Teachers will be expected to be available for meetings and consultations for up to one week before the beginning of the academic year. They will also be expected to complete any necessary school business after the end of each term.
